



1. Were there any resolutions submitted that will be voted upon at the Annual Meeting?

No. A call for resolutions was issued on January 20, 2021 and closed on February 19, 2021. No resolutions were submitted for consideration, which means there are no resolutions to vote on at the 2021 Annual Meeting.

2. Are there any other matters that could be voted upon?

Following public consultation, the Board approved revised by-laws with respect to annual meetings on April 7, 2021. The revised by-laws no longer include a process for motions, and require the Board to approve the past meeting minutes in advance of the annual meeting. These revisions were designed to provide an enhanced experience for annual meeting participants and better demonstrate consistency with NSCN's regulatory mandate. Without any resolutions submitted in advance, there will be no matters that require a registrant vote at the 2021 Annual Meeting.

3. What if I have a matter I would like to bring forward to the NSCN Board?

A meeting attendee may ask questions or submit comments regarding a nursing regulatory matter during the discussion period at the annual meeting. Board policy permits registrants to submit a resolution for the Board's consideration throughout the year (Board policy 3.13.4). This process enables registrants to bring issues to the Board for consideration in a more timely manner throughout the year without waiting until the Annual Meeting.

4. Am I able to ask questions at the meeting?

Yes. Meeting attendees will have the opportunity to participate in discussions and pose questions via the written chat function in the online platform. There will be a discussion period held at the end of the meeting after the presentation of the Annual Meeting information.

5. What is the process to ask questions in the online format?

All stakeholders can ask a question or make a comment via the online chat function for discussion during the scheduled discussion period. Participants can type their question into the chat forum and a moderator will read the question so that all participants can hear the question and the response.

6. What type of questions can I ask?

Meeting participants may ask a question or make a comment on the information presented during the Annual Meeting or other nursing regulatory matters.

7. If I ask a question, am I guaranteed to get a response?

Yes. We will do our best to answer all questions in the time allotted. If there is not enough time to address all questions and comments, we will collect all questions and provide written responses that will be made available to stakeholders on our website following the Annual Meeting.

The Board Chair, under By-law 26.2 has the authority to "make procedural rulings or determinations on any matter relevant to the meeting", which may include decisions regarding time management. Where the Chair considers it appropriate, a matter may also be deferred for further consideration and response by the NSCN Board or NSCN staff.
